<p><b>ADDRESSING THE PROMPT</b></p> <p><i>The student addressed all parts of the prompt directly and fully. The writing stays on-topic throughout.</i></p>						
<p><b>STRUCTURE</b></p> <p><i>Writing is organized logically and is easy to follow. There is a clear introduction, one or more detailed paragraphs, and a concluding statement related to the ideas presented.</i></p>						
<p><b>ELABORATION</b></p> <p><i>The student elaborated on his/her ideas using precise detail, specific examples, and/or quotations/paraphrases from the text. The student made important aspects about the story elements (characters, setting, and plot) clear and understandable for people unfamiliar with the book.</i></p>						
<p><b>CRAFT</b></p> <p><i>Many ideas are linked using transitional words and phrases. The student used strong and precise vocabulary that makes the meaning clear.</i></p>						
<p><b>LANGUAGE CONVENTIONS</b></p> <p><i>Writing has few errors in spelling, punctuation, capitalization, or grammar. Fifth grade high-frequency words are all spelled correctly. Sentences are complete and don't run-on. Sentence beginnings and proper nouns are capitalized. The student proofread his/her work carefully.</i></p>
